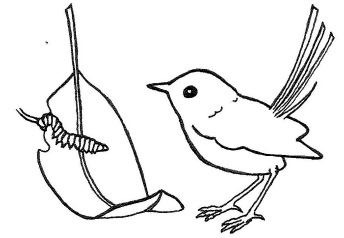

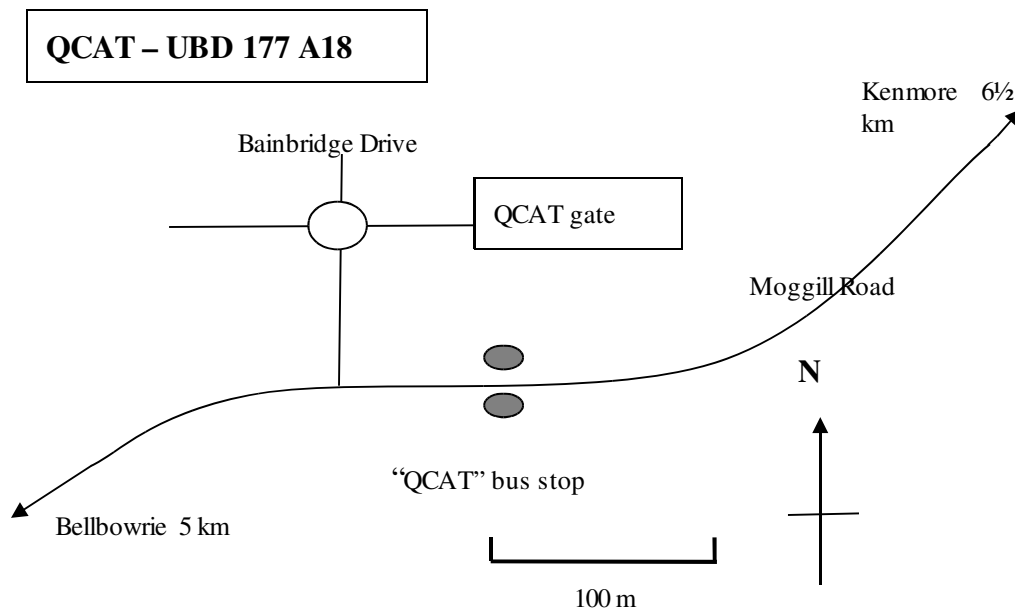

Public transport Bus 444 runs every 15 minutes from the City and Indooroopilly and from Moggill.

Car. Ample parking is available, and directions will be provided at the gate.

If you know that you will be arriving after 9.30 am, please ring beforehand, and we will ensure that the gate is open for you.
